



The Nevins Teaching and Clinical Research Fellowship

Purpose of the Fellowship

The Nevins Teaching and Clinical Research Fellowship was created to address the retention of top periodontal clinical researchers and educators early in their careers. This Fellowship is intended to provide personal funding and support to those individuals who may be facing educational debt while striving to establish themselves in an academic role. The award was created by generous donors in honor of Myron Nevins, DDS, a leader in periodontal clinical research. A board-certified periodontist who practices in Swampscott, MA, Dr. Nevins has served as President of the American Academy of Periodontology; Director and Chairman of the American Board of Periodontology; and is the Editor of *The International Journal of Periodontics & Restorative Dentistry*. His teaching experience includes appointments at Harvard School of Dental Medicine, the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine, the University of North Carolina, and Temple University.

Award

The Nevins Fellowship will be a \$20,000 Fellowship paid over two years. The Fellow will receive \$10,000 at the end of each of two years of full-time academic teaching experience. It is intended to supplement the fellow's income and not intended to replace any salary or stipend to which the Fellow would otherwise be entitled.

At the end of each fellowship year, the fellow is expected to submit a brief report detailing his/her major goals and how the fellowship is helping to attain them.

Eligibility

Full-time periodontal educators who have been teaching at least two, and not more than five, full-time academic years at US programs are eligible to apply. Applicants must be board-certified in periodontology and members of the American Academy of Periodontology (AAP). A selection committee will select three finalists from the applications which are received. The finalists must then attend mandatory personal interviews which will take place at the AAP Annual Meeting. Two nights of lodging will be provided to each finalist at one of the main meeting hotels. Transportation is the responsibility of the finalist.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE APPLICANT

Completed applications must be received by the Foundation on or before July 1. The components of the application packet may be mailed separately as they are available, or they may be mailed together. The application packet must include:

- Completed application form
- Curriculum Vitae
- A letter of nomination from the Dean or Department Chair at the applicant's employing institution
- Two letters of recommendation from individuals able to speak to the applicant's experience in clinical research and teaching
- A personal statement of 1,000-1,500 words in which the applicant details his/her professional achievements, clinical research studies, career goals and future plans, and financial circumstances.
